Our Duties

CSNT predominantly respond to ASB noise complaints made to the Police using the 101 service. Edinburgh Service Centre (Police) email the details to mailbox

CSNT officers investigate the noise complaint and take the appropriate actions to reduce the level of noise whilst offering the public advice.

As the only Night Team with regards to Community Safety, CSNT also deals with case work referrals and operations during these hours. Examples of these include patrols in high risk locations or gathering evidence outside of office hours.

We are happy to contribute to case work from localities, with a designated team member acting as a point of contact

Referrals can be made through the template issued for individual case referrals where extra support is required to gather evidence during the evening, impact statements and general stair enquiries to support your case work.

Referrals are welcome for operations within your localities, please state times required for any operation, this will allow us to take on several operations and individual case work at one time

CSNT works in line with the Edinburgh Partnership, collaborating across agencies to deliver a holistic range of community justice services.
