Calls from 25/4/2021 – 19/5/2021

Breakdown of calls in North Leith/Newhaven:

- Approx 200 calls in total
- 11 road traffic calls
- 2 neighbour disputes
- 24 Calls of theft/hb
- 5 domestic related calls
- 1 assault call
- 26 public nuisance/noise calls
- 20 concern for/missing person
- 3 drug related calls

Local Issues we have been tackling:

- Anti Social Behaviour at Ocean Terminal
- Speeding in built up areas
- Bogus workmen
- Public drinking
- Parking issues outside schools

Police action taken:

- Regular Patrols of Ocean Terminal and public parks
- Speed checks carried out at Hawthornvale and Newhaven Road
- Visits to vulnerable residents to provide advice on doorstep crime
- Patrols of Leith Shore and walkways
- Patrolling round local schools at busy periods

Advice and Support

Coronavirus Regulations

- Edinburgh is now at Level 2 and you can meet socially in groups of up to:
- 6 people from 3 households in your home or theirs – and can stay overnight
- 6 people from 3 households in an indoor public place like a café, pub or restaurant
- 8 people from 8 households outdoors

Helpful Advice

Be Wary Of:

- Cold Callers who ask you to call them back
- Fraudsters keeping your phone line open when you think you've hung up

Banks and Police will Never:

- Ask for your pin or request you to transfer money to another account
- Come to your home to collect money, cards or cheques
- Ask you to purchase goods using your card

Remember:

- Not to disclose your pin, passwords and bank details to cold callers
- To terminate a call before attempting a call back
- If you feel concerned during a call – terminate a call at anytime – don't be afraid to do so
- If you are suspicious contact police by calling 101 immediately
